



Public Notification

Please note that the following Public Notification was an interim action under section 35 of the *Health Professions Act*, RSBC 1996, c 183 (the “Act”). **This action is no longer in effect.**

Date of action: June 2013

Description of action taken:

The Inquiry Committee imposes limits and conditions on the practice of Dr. Julie Moore, ND (“the Registrant”), license #330, under section 35(1)(a) of the *Act*, pending the outcome of an investigation.

The following limits and conditions are imposed on the Registrant’s practice:

- 1) Dr. Moore shall not write an initial prescription without an in-person consultation with the patient;
- 2) Dr. Moore shall not prescribe drugs without an appropriate history, physical exam, and/or appropriate laboratory work;
- 3) Dr. Moore must not issue prescriptions or prescription renewals without proper laboratory and other monitoring.

Reasons for action taken:

The temporary suspension is intended by the Inquiry Committee to protect the public.

In imposing the limits and conditions, the Inquiry Committee has considered the interim reports provided to the Inquiry Committee by the Inspector assigned to investigate the complaint against Dr. Moore. The interim reports contain prima facie evidence that, if believed, would give rise to concerns that Dr. Moore may have, *inter alia*:

- 1) prescribed drugs to persons she had not met; and/or

- 2) prescribed drugs without taking or recording a patient history, conducting a proper physical examination, or adequately monitoring patients' progress with laboratory tests.

The Inquiry Committee has the power to take interim action, including suspension, against registrants under section 35 of the Act. Measures taken under section 35(1) pertain to matters which are and remain unproven unless admitted by a registrant or determined by the Discipline Committee. Actions taken under section 35(1) are subject to appeal to the Supreme Court of British Columbia.
