

# Graham Breault, Former RMT

**Date of Action:**

**Nature of Action:** Pursuant to section 35(1)(a) of the *Health Professions Act* (the “Act”), the Inquiry Committee (the “Committee”) made an order restricting Mr. Breault’s practice subject to certain conditions, including that Mr. Breault be chaperoned during each visit with a female patient while the order remains in force and effect.

**Reasons:** The College received a complaint alleging that Mr. Breault touched a female patient in a non-therapeutic, sexual manner while providing massage therapy to her. The Committee was satisfied that the information available indicated that there was a real risk to the public which required that the public be protected by an interim order. The Committee was satisfied that the risk to the public would be protected in a sufficient and proportionate manner through conditions requiring Mr. Breault to use an approved chaperone who must be present at all times during every treatment of a female patient and with regular reporting to the College on the use of chaperones.

The order ceased to be in effect on December 7, 2018, as Mr. Breault ceased to be a registrant of CMTBC on that date.

**Important Note:** Limits, conditions and suspensions ordered by the Inquiry Committee under section 35(1) of the Act are made to protect the public during an investigation or pending a hearing of the Discipline Committee. Measures taken under section 35(1) of the Act pertain to matters which are and remain unproven unless admitted by a registrant or determined by the Discipline Committee.
