



Notice of Discipline Hearing

Kal Lee, Registered Acupuncturist (“R.ac.”)

Location: Kamloops, BC

Notice Date: February 27, 2026

Nature of Action: On January 22, 2026, the College of Complementary Health Professionals of BC (“CCHPBC”) Registrar issued a citation to R.ac. Kal Lee under section 37 of the *Health Professions Act* (the “HPA”).

The citation notifies Mr. Lee that the CCHPBC Discipline Committee will conduct a hearing to inquire into his conduct as follows:

1. On or about August 21, 2024, he provided treatment to a patient and, in relation to this treatment, he:
 - a. failed to document timely and accurate reports of relevant observations, including conclusions drawn from them, contrary to section 2.8 of Table 2 of Schedule 11 of the College Bylaws;
 - b. failed to maintain accurate, clear and concise documentation regarding the patient’s initial assessment, diagnosis, treatment and follow-up treatment, contrary to section 2.2(b) and (c) of the Practice Standard: Clinical Record Keeping for Traditional Chinese Medicine Professionals and Acupuncturists;
 - c. failed to maintain a confidential file for the patient, contrary to section 2 of the Practice Standard: Clinical Record Keeping for Traditional Chinese Medicine Professionals and Acupuncturists;
 - d. failed to obtain valid consent to treatment from the patient, contrary to section 14 of the Practice Standard: Consent to Treatment for Traditional Chinese Medicine Professionals and Acupuncturists and section 2.2(f) of the Practice Standard: Clinical Record Keeping for Traditional Chinese Medicine Professionals and Acupuncturists.
 - e. failed to record the patient’s consent, refusal, or withdrawal of consent to treatment in the clinical record, contrary to section 15 of the Practice Standard: Consent to Treatment for Traditional Chinese Medicine Professionals and Acupuncturists;
 - f. failed to check with the patient to reconfirm consent when there were signs that the patient’s wish to receive an assessment, treatment, or procedure had changed, contrary to section 5 of the Practice Standard: Consent to Treatment for Traditional Chinese Medicine Professionals and Acupuncturists.



- g. did not act in the best interest of the patient or provide safe, professional, quality patient care when he dismissed or failed to address the patient's reports of pain during treatment, and the patient's inquiries about the treatment provided, contrary to sections 2(a), (b) and (f) of the Practice Standard: Ethical Practice and Professional Accountability for Traditional Chinese Medicine Professionals and Acupuncturists.
2. He failed to cooperate with the College's Investigations.
