



Naturopathic Physicians 2026 Registration Renewal

Frequently Asked Questions

Please note: CCHPBC receives a high volume of inquiries through emails and phone calls during the renewal period. We may take longer than usual in order to accurately address each registrant's inquiry. If the matter affects a large group of registrants, kindly note we are working proactively to address them. We appreciate your patience and understanding as we work to assist with your inquiries one by one.

Q1: I renewed my practising/non-practising registration in December 2025, do I have to complete the renewal again?

A: Yes, Naturopathic Physicians are required to complete the registration renewal if they wish to maintain practising/non-practising registration for **April 1, 2026 – March 31, 2027**. The December 2025 renewal period was for January-March 31, 2026 and was charged at a pro-rated fee based on three months of registration.

Q2: Can I change my status from practising to non-practising status?

A: Yes, you must send the Non-Practising Registrant Registration form to registration@cchpbc.ca in time for it to be processed before March 31, 2026. You must also complete your renewal before 11:59PM on March 31, 2026 to keep Non-Practising status for April 1, 2026-March 31, 2026.

The form is available for ND registrants in [ROSS](#) (Forms & Resources > Registration > Non-Practising Registrant Registration Form).

Q3: When do I have to complete my change of status by?

A: Your change of status to Non-Practising registration must be completed before 4:30PM on March 31, 2026 and you must complete your renewal before the 11:59PM March 31, 2026 deadline.

Q4: What happens if I miss the renewal deadline?

A: If you do not meet all renewal requirements (licence renewal and payment) by 11:59PM on March 31, 2026, the consequences are significant:

- Your licence is cancelled, and you cannot work until your licence is reinstated.
- You must apply for and be successfully reinstated before returning to work.
- You are charged a reinstatement application fee in addition to the annual licence fee and must complete a Criminal Record Check Consent Form and Reinstatement Application.



Technical difficulties or other challenges encountered are not a valid reason for failing to complete the renewal process by the deadline. If you encounter any issues please contact registration@cchpbc.ca as soon as possible to ensure your renewal is completed by the deadline.

Q5: How do I cancel my registration?

A: Email registration@cchpbc.ca to obtain the Cancellation Form and instructions if you wish to cancel your registration prior to April 1, 2026.

Q6: What are the requirements for my registration renewal?

A: You are required to complete your renewal application in [ROSS](#) and pay the registration fee. If your criminal record check is expired, then it will prevent your renewal. Please contact registration@cchpbc.ca if your criminal record check is expired. Not having other administrative requirements, such as Professional Liability Insurance, CPR-HCP with AED/BLS-HCP, NALS, etc. will not prevent your renewal, but are subject to audit by the College. It is the responsibility of the registrant to ensure that they always meet all administrative requirements.

Q7: Do I have to complete continuing education requirements?

A: No, Effective February 18, 2026, completion and reporting of existing QA requirements listed below is not required:

- Continuing Education (CE)
- Practice Development Programs (PDP)
- Practice Support Program (PSP)
- Required course

Q8: I am a Naturopathic Doctor and I can't renew, what am I missing?

A: If you are unable to renew, please confirm that you have no unpaid invoices. If you are still unable to access the renewal, please contact registration@cchpbc.ca as soon as possible.

Q9: What are the fees associated with this year's renewal?

A: Naturopathic Doctor fees:

- Practising renewal \$2645
- Non-practising renewal \$2090

Q10: I will only be working as a Naturopathic Doctor in BC for a few months after April 1. Can I receive a refund for the remaining months?

A: No, there are no refunds issued for College fees.



Q11: I will not be practising April 1 but plan to practise later in the year. What are my renewal options?

A: You can choose to maintain your full licence for the year or cancel your licence and apply for reinstatement prior to returning to practice.

Q12: After this renewal, do I have to complete another registration renewal this year?

A: No, once you renew your registration for April 1, 2026-March 31, 2027 you will not need to renew your registration until 2027.

Q13: Do I have to complete the Health Profession Corporation Permit (HPC) renewal?

A: No, all Naturopathic Medicine Health Profession Corporation permits are valid until March 31, 2027.

Q14: When do I have to complete the registration renewal by?

A: All Naturopathic Doctors must complete their renewal by 11:59PM March 31, 2026 to avoid their registration being cancelled.

Q15: I have noted a response in my declaration. Can you please advise on the process and when I will know my registration renewal has been approved and completed?

A: When a written response is received to a declaration it is flagged for manual review. Once it is reviewed your application will either be approved or you will be asked for additional information for the review. Once the application is approved the registration expiration date on the Annual Registration Card will be updated to March 31, 2027.

Q16: The system does not allow me to pay my registration fee. What should I do?

A: For Naturopathic Doctors who experience an error on the payment screen, please try logging out of [ROSS](#) and then completing the renewal application again. If the issue persists, please contact registration@cchpbc.ca as soon as possible to ensure that your renewal is able to be completed by the deadline.

Q17: My registration expiration date is still March 31, 2026 but I have received email confirmation of my renewal. How do I fix this?

A: Please contact registration@cchpbc.ca as soon as possible. Please include the confirmation email that you received confirming your renewal has been completed.

Q18: I don't have access to a computer; how do I complete the online renewal?

A: You may complete the renewal on a mobile device or use a publicly accessible computer such as those available at the Public Library.

Q19: I don't have a credit card; how do I make payment?

A: You can pay by certified bank order, cheque, or money order. When you mail or drop off a cheque, money order, or bank draft, please ensure there is enough time for it to be received before the March 31, 2026 deadline.

Q20: Can I break my registration fee payment into installments?

A: The College does not offer a standard installment plan for registration fees. Financial hardship requests are considered on a case-by-case basis, please contact registration@cchpbc.ca for more information.

Q21: How do I proceed with changing my name?

A: You may change your name on the Public Register by submitting the Registrant Name Change Form available in [ROSS](#) (Forms & Resources > Registration > Registrant Name Change Form) along with two pieces of government-issued identification as listed on the form to registration@cchpbc.ca

Q22: Do I have to complete my reinstatement before March 31, 2026?

A: In order to be eligible to practise on April 1, 2026 you will need to complete your reinstatement requirements before March 31, 2026. Please contact registration@cchpbc.ca for specific information on your reinstatement.

Q23: I do not have Prescriptive Authority and I cannot get past step 8 in the renewal. What do I do?

Select Agree and then click next. The College is aware of the issue and it will not impact your renewal.

IMPORTANT: HPOA and changes to Bylaws

The information on status changes / reinstatement requirements mentioned above is based on current CCHPBC [Bylaws](#). The *Health Professions and Occupation Act* (HPOA) received royal assent in 2022. When the HPOA becomes enforced, there may be changes in Bylaws that impact requirements. Information about any changes will be communicated to all practising and non-practising registrants via email when it is available.
