Nature of Action: On February 23, 2026, Dr. Jennifer McNeill, DC (the “Registrant”), entered into an Undertaking and Consent Agreement pursuant to section 33(6)(c) and section 36(1) of the *Health Professions Act*, following an investigation by the College of Complementary Health Professionals of B.C.’s (the “College”) Inquiry Committee into allegations that the Registrant made false claims to an insurance provider.

Background: Dr. Jennifer McNeill is a College registrant and chiropractor. On May 20, 2025, the College received a public complaint involving allegations that the Registrant had submitted false insurance claims.

Resolution: The Inquiry Committee resolved to dispose of the matter by requiring that the Registrant undertake or consent to the following:

- a formal reprimand from the College;
- agree not to repeat the conduct of submitting false insurance claims;
- a suspension of her registration with the College for a period of 5 days;
- complete a learning course on professional ethics;
- cooperate with the College’s random audits of the Registrant’s billing and clinical records practices for a period of one year;
- agrees to undertake a meeting with a College Practice Advisor (CPA) to discuss the conduct issues outlined in the Agreement, and agrees to attend additional meetings with the CPA as required in the opinion of the CPA, which may be scheduled at the discretion of the CPA.
- cover a portion of the costs of the investigation.

The Inquiry Committee is satisfied that this resolution is consistent with the College’s mandate to serve and protect the public.
