



Notice of Discipline Hearing

Yin-Jen Hsu, R.ac.

Location: Richmond, BC

Nature of Action: On January 9, 2026, the Registrar issued a citation to Yin-Jen Hsu under section 37 of the *Health Professions Act*.

The citation notifies Mr. Hsu that the Discipline Committee will conduct a hearing to inquire into his conduct as follows:

1. From about 2017 to 2022 (the “Material Time”), he failed to take reasonable steps to ensure his employees at the Yoho Body Care clinic in Richmond, BC (the “Yoho Clinic”) were not engaging in sex work with patients. Particulars of this allegation are that he failed to:
 - a. Provide adequate supervision of employees to ensure they were not providing sexual services;
 - b. Immediately investigate any employee whom he had reason to believe were providing sexual services; and
 - c. Maintain or enforce a policy of zero-tolerance for sex work by employees, including by promptly terminating the employment of any employee whom he had reason to believe was providing sexual services.
2. He failed to comply with a standard respecting the practice of acupuncture imposed by the CTCMA under the HPA, namely the “Jurisprudence Course Handbook: Important Legal Principles Practitioners Need to Know” at part 2.E in respect of his billing practices. Particulars of this allegation are:
 - a. On May 9, 2022, at the Yoho Clinic, he issued a receipt for acupuncture services to an undercover investigator identified as “A.A.” who attended the Yoho Clinic for a massage and to whom he did not provide acupuncture services.
 - b. During the Material Time, approximately once or twice a month, at the Yoho Clinic, he issued receipts for acupuncture services to patients who had received massage services and had not received acupuncture services and charged an additional \$15 fee for doing so.
3. At the Yoho Clinic, he failed to comply with section 2.2 of the Practice Standard on Clinical Record-Keeping with respect to the patients listed in Schedule A by:
 - a. Failing to keep a Patient Health Record including a patient history and records of the initial assessment/diagnosis and treatment, follow-up treatment, information on other health care provider treatment, and tests and reports;
