Summary of Order: A Panel of the Inquiry Committee (the “Panel”) of the College of Complementary Health Professionals (the “College”) ordered that Tyler Jackson (the “Registrant”)’s practice of chiropractic be subject to limits and conditions to protect the public during an investigation, pursuant to section 35(1)(a) of the *Health Professions Act*.

The Panel concluded that the following interim conditions are necessary in this case:

- i. The Registrant’s communication with patients is restricted to that which is necessary to provide chiropractic services;
- ii. The Registrant is prohibited from contacting patients via text message or social media;
- iii. The Registrant must, by 6:00 p.m. every other Friday, while these limits or conditions are in effect, provide the College with, or electronic access to, the Registrant’s calendar, including the name and contact information for each patient he treated in the preceding week.
- iv. If the Registrant continues to provide services at the Clinic or any other clinic with an open treatment area, the Registrant must post a notice on the front door of the Clinic, in the reception area of the Clinic, and in the Clinic’s treatment area stating as follows:

Tyler Jackson, DC, is restricted to communicating with patients only to the extent necessary to provide chiropractic services and he is prohibited from contacting patients via text message or social media by order of the Inquiry Committee of the College of Complementary Health Professionals of British Columbia, dated March 3, 2026. The notice must be printed on 8 x 11 inch paper and in, at least, 28 point font.
- v. If the Registrant provides chiropractic services at any other clinic, he must post in a prominent place in any treatment room where he provides treatment and in the reception area, a notice that is printed on 8 x 11 inch paper and in, at least 28 point font, the following notice:

Legal Framework: Section 35(1) of the *Act* authorizes the Panel to implement limits and conditions on practice to protect the public from harm before an investigation or discipline hearing is complete. This is not a final disposition, but an urgent, protective, and temporary measure that will remain in effect until the matter is concluded. Measures taken under section 35(1) of the *Act* pertain to allegations which are unproven unless admitted by a registrant or determined by the Discipline Committee.

Reasons: The Order was made following a complaint from a member of the public that the Registrant sent an explicit photograph to a patient. The Panel considered the allegations serious and recognized the presence of factors that render the alleged sexual misconduct likely to recur. The allegation is a serious breach of boundaries that constitutes sexual misconduct.

The Panel was concerned that there is a risk of the conduct being repeated if an interim order is not made. Having weighed the different options and the circumstances of this case and having considered the impact on the Registrant, the Panel concluded that the above-described limits and conditions are proportionate and sufficient to protect the public during the investigation or pending a discipline hearing.
