About the health profession regulatory colleges

There are six health profession regulatory colleges that oversee 25 regulated health professions in BC. Their purpose is to regulate health professionals by setting licensing, practice, and ethical standards among other things. They are **governed by a board** that makes decisions and sets the strategic priorities while acting in the public interest.

Compensation

Board members can be compensated at an hourly, half-day, or full-day rate, or through an annual retainer pay rate. Rates can vary for colleges. Board members are compensated for their time, which can include meetings and preparation.

- Contribute to big-picture strategic and financial decisions
- Uphold confidentiality, an Oath of Office, and guiding principles that protect the public from harm and discrimination

Application process

The Health Professions and Occupations Regulatory Oversight Office runs a recruitment and assessment process to recommend board members to BC's six health profession regulatory colleges. Applicants can apply to specific advertised opportunities or through an open call process to be considered for current and future opportunities.



Time commitment

In-person or virtual meetings are held at least four times a year, and may be one to two day-long sessions. Board meeting preparation is required, and may take several hours of pre-work.

Members are required to check and respond to board related emails regularly. Some travel may be required.
